14-18 July 2022

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1. Methodology

Data Collection

This study was conducted via touch-tone response automated phone survey conducted 14-18 July 2022. Surveys are conducted between 17:30 - 20:20 weekdays and 10:00 - 17:30 Saturdays at the local time of respondents so as to not over-sample nonworkers and stay-at-homes.

The study was conducted among a sample of n=985 people aged 18 years and over from a population of 431,215. Telephone numbers were licensed from a commercial provider and include both landline and mobile phone numbers. In this survey 40.6% of respondents were reached via mobile phone.

Weighting

Following the completion of the surveys, the data was cell-weighted by gender and age to reflect local population proportions.


The effective sample size following weighting is 491 meaning the effective margin of error is +/-4.4%.

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Respondent Geography



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


2. Issues of Concern



2.1 Opinion on Property Developer Licenses

Property developers do not require a license to operate in the ACT. The ACT Government has flagged introducing a new license which would require property developers to demonstrate financial capacity to complete any proposed developments and a commitment to ethical behaviour. However it now seems uncertain whether the ACT Government will proceed with introducing a license. What is your opinion?



What is your opinion on the following statements? Property developers have too much unrestricted power in Canberra.



What is your opinion on the following statements? Developers in Canberra are too reckless about adhering to community standards and need stricter controls.



What is your opinion on the following statements? The ACT Government should get tougher on property developers and subject them to stronger regulation.







What is your opinion on the following statements? Property developers in Canberra are already subject to sufficient oversight and should not be subjected to more red tape.


